



REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS

Description of Project

LISC Safety provides training and technical assistance to place-based crime prevention efforts in cities around the country. This includes technical assistance (TA) activities associated with an award from the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) under the Byrne Criminal Justice Innovation Program (BCJI). As part of the White House Neighborhood Revitalization Initiative (NRI), BCJI supports comprehensive place-based and community-oriented initiatives that engage leaders from multiple sectors and disciplines to work together to reduce and prevent crime and revitalize communities. Local BCJI grantees are planning and implementing responses to the drivers of crime in persistent problem areas in their communities using a range of evidence-based strategies involving enforcement, prevention, intervention and treatment. Program priorities include strong use of research and data to guide decision-making; ongoing community engagement; and integrating crime responses with broader neighborhood revitalization activities.

LISC supports the BCJI grantees and other place-based crime prevention practitioners with on-site technical assistance (TA), web-based tools, webinars, workshops, written tools, and online training. Technical assistance is typically designed to meet specific local needs identified through a LISC assessment process. In the case of projects funded by BCJI, LISC conducts those assessments with BJA and BCJI grantees, and emphasizes needs related to community engagement, research-practitioner partnerships, cross-sector partnership sustainability, connecting crime prevention to neighborhood revitalization – as well as needs related to site-specific crime strategies. TA interventions range from an hour-long consultation with an individual grantee/partner to a several-month engagement providing intensive assistance to a grantee and its cross-sector partners.

Description of Services Required

This Request for Qualifications (RFQ) seeks consultants to supplement LISC's existing staff capacity to deliver TA through LISC Safety, with a particular emphasis on TA under BCJI. This solicitation does not have a deadline for submission of qualifications. Submissions of qualifications in response to this RFQ will be considered as they are received and through the contract end date or until available funds are committed, whichever comes sooner. Funds will be awarded and work conducted in accordance with all applicable federal regulations and requirements, including but not limited to those of DOJ's Bureau of Justice Assistance. All services will be provided under the supervision of LISC national and local staff.

LISC seeks consultants to assist with **delivering direct technical assistance and on-site trainings related to Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED), Safegrowth, or other crime prevention efforts that focus on the physical environment, and for training efforts such as conference sessions and/or developing web-based materials, written products, and online workshops.** TA will focus on the following areas of need:

- 1) Providing CPTED or similar training to residents, law enforcement and other community partners in support of local BCJI efforts. This includes development of curriculum and

materials appropriate to a diverse audience of trainee to cover strategies to prevent crime through addressing the physical environment and through collaborative problem-solving partnerships;

- 2) Working with selected sites to customizing the above training to select sites including working with site representatives to identify, assess, and target crime hot spots or crime problems identified under the BCJI program;
- 3) As a direct technical assistance provider, developing and implementing place-based strategies to develop social, economic and physical assets to prevent and reduce crime and increase collective efficacy in neighborhoods, such as efforts to address blight or to encourage development;
- 4) Developing and delivering training or distance learning content to provide background and information on CPTED and/or crime prevention approaches that address the physical environment and collaborative, problem-solving strategies to reduce crime and disorder;
- 5) Supporting strong research-practitioner partnerships including assisting with identification of crime-related problems and helping to establish comprehensive and evidence-informed strategies for program implementation.

Small Business Enterprises (SBEs), Minority-Owned Business Enterprises (MBEs), and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (WBEs)

LISC is committed to working with SBEs, MBEs, and WBEs, and encourages proposals from SBEs, MBEs, and WBEs.

Qualifications

Consultants must complete the attached RFQ form *and* submit résumés or biographical descriptions of consultants and subcontractors who will be providing TA under this contract.

Evaluation and Selection Criteria

The LISC Safety team, together with LISC local offices and national LISC Grants and Contract Management staff, will evaluate submissions of qualifications based upon: experience, expertise in a listed TA topic, rate/price, location, availability, and references. Information about consultants selected under this RFQ will be shared with funders for approval as needed, including BJA for BCJI-related TA engagements. Please note that time-based compensation exceeding \$650/day requires special approval from DOJ for work related to BCJI. Once approved, consultants will be qualified to do work under LISC's BCJI award or related CSI TA awards. Qualified consultants will then be selected for TA assignments based on their relevant qualifications as needs arise.
