Launch Year Support

In partnership with TCSA, we provide training, planning and technical support to newly approved charter schools in the year leading up to the first day of school with students.



Document Review

We review policies, budgets, financial statements, & corporate documents to verify that they are complete and appropriate based on best practices.



Emerging School Support

We assist schools with less than two years of operation through collaboration and thought partnership in charter school administration and operations.



Targeted Expertise

We are pros in finance & budgeting, facilities & real estate, grant management, compliance, procurement, and policy development & review.



Facilities Planning

We guide schools through the facilities planning process, focusing on feasibility, community demographics, budgeting, targets and potential cost calculations.
