Rural LISC Recognized with Two National Excellence Awards

IEDC honors economic development orgs with awards for excellence in the field

Washington, DC –Rural LISC today announced it has been recognized with a silver award in the Multimedia/Video Promotion category and a bronze award in the Print Brochure category at the 2022 Excellence in Economic Development Awards from The International Economic Development Council (IEDC), the largest nonprofit professional association for professional economic developers in the world.

The awards honor organizations for exemplary economic development marketing campaigns, projects, and programs. 25 award categories honor organizations and individuals for their efforts in creating positive change in urban, suburban, & rural communities.

"In 2021 when our annual Rural LISC Seminar was moved to all virtual due to the pandemic, the event's signature site visit to local partner programs would be lost," said Caitlin Cain, LISC Vice President and Rural LISC Director. "These bus tours had been synonymous with our annual Seminars to demonstrate our innovative approach to economic development with local partners. In this instance, we were able to capture inspirational stories in Clarksdale, Mississippi, where the community continues to work to overcome a declining population, poor health care, empty buildings, and struggling schools, to a community coming together to offer entrepreneurial growth, new training opportunities, creative placemaking, and hope."

Rural LISC's bronze award recognizes the *Affordable Housing Developers' Broadband Handbook*, a comprehensive guide for affordable housing stakeholders developed with telecommunications experts, CTC Technology & Energy, to demystify the process of planning for, paying for, and advocating for better connectivity in their residential communities.

"Addressing connectivity gaps tops the list of nearly every rural community's economic development agenda," said Christa Vinson, Senior Program Officer at Rural LISC. "Building the 'last mile' of broadband infrastructure to reach every home is key to long-term American competitiveness: it is part of the foundation of economic growth and essential to addressing education, health, and economic inequality."
