Overview

The Food Security and Shelter COVID-19 Community Action Working Group is establishing two (2) Stakeholder Advisory Groups to identify challenges, recommend opportunities, and provide feedback on proposed measures to support relief, response, and long-term recovery.

Each advisory group will be comprised of 10-12 members with diverse backgrounds and a broad cross-section of professional expertise and personal experience. The group will include representation from community-based organizations, non-profit providers, advocates, public and private sector partners, faith based organizations, experts, and people with lived experience of housing instability or food insecurity.

Strategic Housing Implementation Plan



- 1. Consensus on City affordable housing targets (new construction/rehab, regional centers, specific populations)
- 2. Long and short-term housing goals/priorities (to include COVID Response)
- 3. Coordination with other planning efforts
- **4. Leverage available resources** (land, funding, partnerships)
- 5. Specific targets and goals adopted by different organizations (COSA, SAHA, SAHT, etc.)
- 6. Track and measure progress

City of San Antonio Counseling Focus

- Counseling will form an important part of the Recovery and Resiliency efforts
- Informed by Relief efforts (emergency grants) and other existing NHSD programs
- Interdepartmental collaboration

Bexar County Focus Commissioner Justin Rodriguez

Housing Security

- Divert and prevent homelessness through short-term rental and utility assistance
- Inform residents of property tax protest process and available relief programs
- Coordinate and align resources and information to support tenants with pending eviction cases

Affordable Housing

- Implement LISC Strategy Playbook
 - Prioritize extending Period of Affordability (POA) for units where POA is slated to expire within the next 6
 months
 - Rehabilitate existing housing stock into affordable housing
 - Explore clearing titles for tax-foreclosed properties for rehab and infill-development
