

Population by Age


Between 2010 and 2016 the population of OST/South Union increased by 7%




BUILD FAMILY INCOME AND WEALTH





In 2016, 77% of residents had health insurance, higher than in Houston overall. In 2010 40% had health insurance coverage.






Midtown TIRZ Ownership Map 105 parcels in OST/ South Union







The number of multi-family units in OST/South Union increased between between 2014 and 2016 by 121 units, while the number of single family homes declined




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



Walk Score

In OST / South Union the Walkscore has increased by 5 points in the last four years, rising from 50 to 55
