

PACT RESOURCE TEAM BEING ESTABLISHED TO HELP PUBLIC HOUSING RESIDENTS PLAN FOR FUTURE

 LISC NYC and Public Works Partners Issuing Request for Qualifications from Technical Assistance Providers by March 7, 2022 –

Support For Public Housing
Residents Navigating NYCHA PACT Program -

NEW YORK, NY, February 7, 2022 – LISC NYC and Public Works Partners released a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) today to establish a pool of experienced technical assistance providers who can support New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) residents to plan for the future of their communities as their housing developments receive investment through the Permanent Affordability Commitment Together (PACT) program. PACT is a critical tool that, through partnerships with private and non-profit development partners, allows NYCHA to not only modernize homes, but also provide enhanced community services and amenities.

Providers who are qualified through the RFQ process will become members of the PACT Resource Team, a group of independent organizations and professional consultants able to provide direct, technical assistance to residents. Applicants may include non-profit and/or community-based organizations, architecture and planning firms, legal aid providers, and other entities based in or outside of New York City.

"PACT Resource Team members will provide NYCHA residents and resident leaders with invaluable support that helps inform, organize and empower their involvement in the PACT planning process," said **Jonathan Gouveia, NYCHA's Executive Vice President for Real Estate Development**. "The PACT Resource Team is a great example of the steps the Authority is taking to ensure resident's voices are centered in the planning for the future of their homes."

The PACT Resource Team will support residents to have a voice throughout the PACT investment process, including identifying needs and priorities for investment, selecting PACT Partner teams, informing the physical design of developments, planning for new property management, and augmenting social services and economic empowerment resources.

As project lead, Public Works Partners is guiding the selection of PACT Resource Team members who will support NYCHA residents.

"The PACT Resource Team represents an historic investment in residents and their homes, one that will enhance services and neighborhoods through deep collaboration with NYCHA families and residents," **Celeste Frye, co-founder and CEO of Public Works Partners,** said. "Public Works is excited to launch the next phase of this work—the selection of qualified Resource Team members—alongside community members, our partners, and NYCHA."

Responsible for contract management, LISC NYC is leading the Request for Qualifications process on behalf of the PACT Resource Team.

LISC NYC encourages applications from non-profits, small business enterprises (SBEs), minority-owned business enterprises (MBEs), and women-owned business enterprises (WBEs).
