Eligibility Requirements

The Entrepreneurs of Color Fund – Newark program is designed to support entrepreneurs of color from underserved and underbanked communities based in Newark NJ.

GNEC and LISC Greater Newark will consider candidates that fit the following criteria:

- Businesses must be located in Newark
- Businesses must be 51% owned by an entrepreneur of color
- Entrepreneur of Color is defined as a person of African-American, Hispanic,
 Asian, Pacific-Islander or Native American heritage
- Businesses not eligible include gambling and adult entertainment, among others (case by case analysis)

Terms


The Entrepreneurs of Color Fund – Newark program is designed to bring flexibility to the capital access process. The terms below are for guidance purposes only, and both GNEC and LISC Greater Newark will take a case-by-case approach to prospective applications:

- Loans from \$5,000 \$500,000*
- Terms of up to 84 months
- Competitive interest rates


All eligible candidates will undergo an underwriting process which will consider numerous variables including:

- Credit
- Capacity to pay back
- Collateral
