## **About the Opportunity**

Community Development Advocates of Detroit (CDAD), in partnership with Local-Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC), is building capacity in our ecosystem-building division, which works to develop a comprehensive, equity- and justice-centered community development system in Detroit. This work brings together community leaders and housing developers to address local and regional barriers to affordable and attainable housing, including communications, local policy, equity, development financing and more.

The Project Management Consultant will support implementation of the Regional Housing Partnership in Detroit as part of the <u>Michigan Statewide Housing Plan</u>. They will play a critical role in the advancement of affordable housing and real estate development, and the promotion of racial equity and justice within the city. This role will encompass a range of responsibilities to ensure the success of our collective efforts.

#### **Primary Responsibilities**

#### **Stakeholder Management:**

- Maintain an up-to-date database of project stakeholders, including partners, organizations, and individuals.
- Track attendance at meetings, outreach efforts, and engagement with the project.
- Convene and coordinate the activities of the steering committee to ensure alignment with project goals and strategies.

#### **Communications:**

Support outreach efforts to engage partners and stakeholders

- Issue invitations for meetings, events, and collaborative sessions.
- Assist in the development and execution of a communications strategy to keep stakeholders informed and engaged in the project.
- Compose updates for newsletter, website, and other external communications outlets

#### **Administrative Tasks:**

- Take detailed meeting notes during project-related meetings.
- Schedule and coordinate meetings, including arranging locations, video conferences, and related logistics.
- Follow up on action items and ensure that they are completed in a timely manner.

- Demonstrated commitment to promoting racial equity and justice
- Familiarity with collective impact models

- Experience in scheduling meetings, coordinating working groups, and managing steering committees.
- Proficiency in project management, including tracking timelines, milestones, and deliverables
- Creative problem-solving abilities and the capability to design engaging public-facing meetings and surveys.
- Strong organizational skills and attention to detail.
- Proficiency in database management and stakeholder tracking.
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively within a team environment.
