CVI Keywords:


Cross-sector (multi-sector) collaboration: a process where community stakeholders come together to collectively focus their expertise and resources on a complex issue of importance to a community they serve.

Credible Messenger: a trusted individual with personal experience navigating systems impacting individuals living in that community. Credible Messengers can serve as positive, culturally sensitive role model who provide guidance and support to youth.


